Personal Reflections

*O*ne summer I did a little jogging to get exercise and keep in shape. I worked up to running about half a kilometer, just enough to boast a little—but not much! One morning I decided to press on farther and try to make a full kilometer. Shortly after I passed my usual limit I was sure I would collapse from sheer exhaustion.

Weakness overwhelmed me. My breath came in gasps. My heart was thumping loudly. As I kept pounding down the road putting one foot in front of the other, every step offered a great moment to just quit!

Suddenly, something happened. Apparently, the pros call it “breaking through the wall”. Energy flowed through me. The fatigue vanished! I felt myself bouncing ahead. I finished the kilometer with ease! At the moment of exhaustion adrenalin had kicked in, empowering me with strength to finish the run.

We are running a spiritual race, living for eternal values, aiming to accomplish God’s purposes. The pressures, the pain, the problems—everything screams, “Pack it in. Give up. This would be a great moment to quit!” However, let’s take courage to run on. Through the power of the Holy Spirit we can find unlimited resources in Jesus Christ. Courage will rise, strength will flow, and His mighty presence will bear us forward and upward.

We find this powerful challenge in Hebrews 12:1 and 2, “*Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.*”
